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School History; Founding Story

Brief history about the school from the proprietress

There has always been a passion within me to run a school, especially a preschool. I have a special soft spot for children and I love to observe them doing their things.

In the year 2006, when I was posted to the Demonstration School for the Deaf at Mampong, up the Akuapem Ridge, I started looking around to see if there was an opportunity to start something for children as I had in my heart. I was excited to hear that there was no such school and therefore I could easily establish one.

Unfortunately, though I had identified a clear need for a modern preschool on the Ridge, I was not financially capable of undertaking that venture, so I kept on hoping that God would open an avenue for me. I had told a few friends and family about my intentions to start a school, so we started praying and searching, hoping that God would give us a place.

As we prayed, my attention was on finding a suitable name for the school. I finally settled on Eden, which means God's delight, a blissful abode. It was perfect for me because I wanted a name that was in the Holy Bible and also a simple one that would be easy for children to pronounce.

Now I had the dream; I had a name but I did not have a place to start. Then, Patrick, a brother of mine, suggested I start the school in my hall. It sounded impossible, but I gave it a try. On the **4th of January 2011**, the school was birthed with only one child in my sitting room. Eden Montessori Learning Centre was the first Montessori school on the Akuapem Ridge.

We insisted that everyone in the school used the English language as the only medium for communication. So soon enough, children were communicating fluently in the English language. The use of the Montessori method of teaching was also very helpful for us because our children became independent and very confident in their areas of learning. Parents were surprised to see their little children, four- and five-year-olds reading simple three-letter words and short sentences. Soon, Eden became the talk of the town and the preferred school on the Ridge.

Parents requested we enroll other children in the upper classes, but we insisted on moving at our own pace, growing from one class to the other. As we learned from our mistakes and adapted according to the grace that was upon us, we expanded gradually. In a very short time, the school had taken up all the rooms in my house. There was then a need to expand further, so we sought permission from my landlord and raised a wooden classroom structure in the yard.

In 2015, just as we were getting overwhelmed with our numbers, God came to our aid again by providing us with an 8-classroom block and an office to buy from a school that was folding up.

By October 2016, we moved the children from kindergarten one to Grade 3 to the newly acquired property at Amanfo near Nevaeh Heights Guest House.

Since then, we have grown steadily until now. We have three campuses, the old, new and Gyankama campuses, two housing the preschool and another housing the basic school.

Our Story

We are gathered here this afternoon not to show off, but to testify to everyone how gracious the Lord has been to us. "Not to us, Lord, not to us but to your name be the glory, because of your love and faithfulness." Psalms.
We didn't start with a lot of money in our bank account.
We didn't start with well-furnished classrooms waiting to be filled.
We didn't start with flashy buses to carry our learners to and fro.
But we had God - The Almighty. The Owner of the universe. The One who was, and is, and forever shall be. We made Him our banner, and He is winning the victories for us.
"Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God" _ Psalm 20:7
One thing I know about this God of mine is that He does

not want to bring His name into disrepute. So whatever you entrust to Him, and it is within His will, He makes sure He brings it to a successful end. That is why you see Eden still thriving and flourishing.

Eden has been in existence since 2011. We started with just one child — Ivan Adu Gyebi. Who is now in Level 100 at the University of Ghana, Legon. To God be the glory.

I had always dreamed of having a school, but I didn't know where, when, or how to start it.

In the year 2006, a sister of mine who had studied Montessori Education in the UK started a teacher training program in Accra and I joined.

At the end of the course, she saw potential in me and invited me to assist her as a facilitator. For about 15 years, I ran the training program with her.

In 2010, she insisted that I start my own school at Mampong. It was not an easy decision because I had nothing to start with.

I shared this with my brother, Mr. Patrick Oduro of Hephzibah Christian Centre, and he encouraged me to start it in my hall. It felt awkward, but I gave it a try.

Then came the question of a name. He advised that if I wanted to run a Christian school, the name must define it, and it must be simple enough for every child to mention. So we settled on Eden and the school became Eden Montessori Learning Centre.

With the help of my son, Ivan, a graphic designer, I chose our logo and colors: Sea Blue, Light Orange, and White.

I'm a little artistic myself, so I designed the styles for our school uniforms and we were good to go.

I also received support in various forms from my sisters who run Montessori schools: Hope of Glory - Mamprobi and Kokrobite, Beautiful Beginning - Spintex Road, Mary Land - Dansoman, and Ahenemba International School - Takoradi.

By God's grace, on Tuesday, 4th January 2011, Eden Montessori Learning Centre was birthed.

I remember in the early days, a parent came to make enquiries and asked, "Where is the school?"

I smiled and said, "This is the school."

She shook her head in disbelief and smiled politely. But she gathered courage and enrolled her grandchild, Mame K. Later, she brought two more grandchildren, Kestine

and Yoni.

Another mom said her child would not have friends to play with, so she didn't come back.

But to those who trusted us with their precious gifts, they saw the wonders their children were performing and recommended us, and the school started growing.

Very soon the hall was full. We moved to my children's room, then to my dining area, and eventually the whole house was full.

In 2 years, we were overwhelmed with numbers. Uncle Patrick had cautioned me to be mindful of space because of how the school was growing.

We knocked on our kind landlord's door again, and she permitted us to put up the structure you see at the preschool currently.

Maria Montessori once said, and I quote: "Don't force growth, prepare the environment and life will increase on its own."

The school increased on its own, because we had a prepared environment.

In 2014, God blessed us with our current site, which we call the New Site.

In response to the needs of parents from Akuapem South, we also established another preschool at Gyankama, which by grace is doing well.

In our quest to pursue Christ-centered Education, we joined an NGO in 2018 that works with low-fee Christian Private Schools, known as Edify.

We have received numerous trainings for both teachers and management. We excelled in most of their competitions and performance indicators, and emerged as a Champion School in our cohort. This is the doing of the Lord.

By God's grace, we have also put up a modern preschool block which we hope to move into this September.

These are a few things that make us stand out on the Ridge:

Our pursuit for Christlikeness, Academic Excellence, and our well-mannered learners, and beautiful uniforms.

To enrich our curriculum and help our students compete globally, we have added the Oxford Curriculum to the GES Curriculum and the Montessori Curriculum for the Preschool.

We have written BECE 5 times, and we always come out with 100% pass. May the Lord be praised.

We are very particular about our pursuit of Christlikeness so we have a whole Christian Transformation Officer in the school. We have discipleship as a subject on our time table. We take time to disciple our learners and staff. We

are also in partnership with Character First Education-Kofi Tawiah foundation.

Every long vacation, we encourage our learners to attend Scripture Union, and Christlike Disciple Makers Camps to build them up spiritually.

For the past four times WAEC has released the BECE results, Eden Montessori Learning Centre has consistently achieved a 100% pass rate with single digit aggregates. Every child's performance is a reflection of their ability and we are particularly proud of some of our exceptional learners who have achieved outstanding results.

Our past students' performance in schools abroad showcase our efforts. They have shared how they are excelling due to the foundation built in Eden.

than a school to me. It became home.

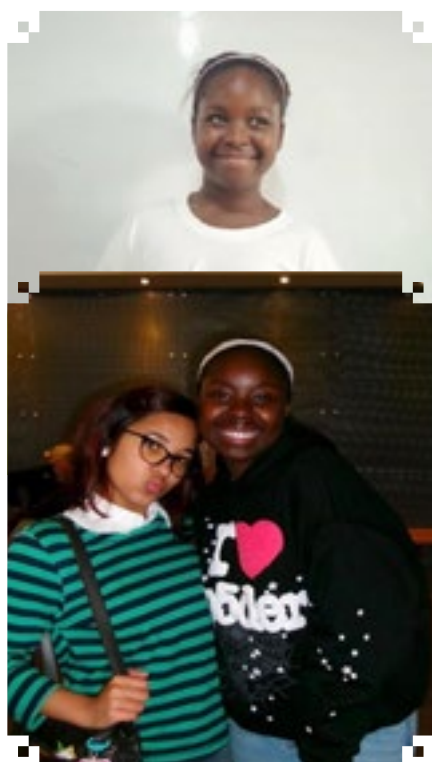
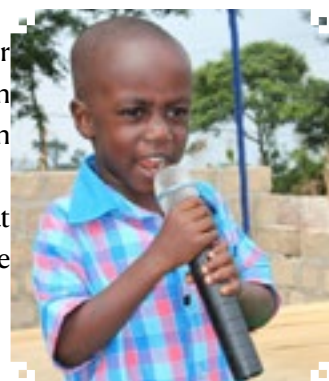

CLASSROOM TIPS

Classroom Tips for Teachers

- **Establish Clear Routines:** Set predictable daily expectations early on to save time and reduce student anxiety.
- **Build Relationships First:** Connect with students as individuals before diving deep into academic content.
- **Praise Specific Actions:** Focus on effort and precise behaviors rather than giving generic compliments.
- **Keep Transitions Smooth:** Use clear cues or timers when moving between activities to maintain momentum.
- **Mix Up Instructional Styles:** Combine visual, auditory, and hands-on activities to reach different learning types.
- **Encourage Student Voice:** Give choice in assignments or discussion topics to foster ownership and engagement.
- **Use Strategic Seating:** Arrange your physical space to encourage collaboration and minimize natural distractions.
- **Incorporate Brain Breaks:** Brief physical or mental pauses help students refocus during long study blocks.
- **Model Emotional Regulation:** Demonstrate calm problem-solving when unexpected interruptions or disruptions happen.
- **Set Up a Visual Agenda:** Post daily schedules and learning objectives where students can easily track them.
- **Differentiate Content Gently:** Adapt tasks to challenge high-flyers while scaffolding support for struggling learners.
- **Gather Quick Feedback:** Use simple exit tickets or quick thumbs-up checks to gauge understanding in real time.
- **Involve Parents Early:** Share positive news with families, not just updates when challenges arise.
- **Protect Your Personal Time:** Set healthy boundaries around grading and emails to keep your energy high.

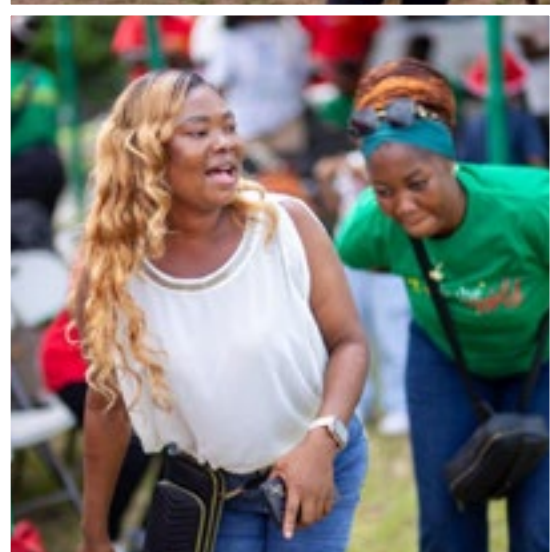

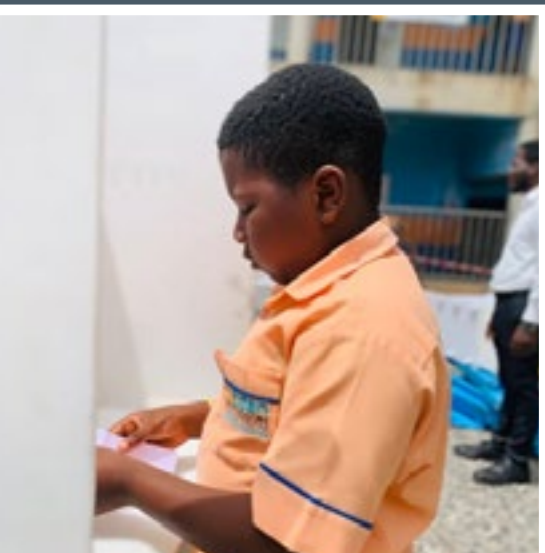
